### MINUTES OF THE REGIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 12.1.2010 AT KVS R.O. BHOPAL, AT 4.30. P.M.

The meeting of the Regional Advisory Committee was held on 12.1.2010 at 4.30 p.m. in the Conference Hall of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Regional Office, Bhopal. The meeting was chaired by Mr. Chandrahas Dubey, I.A.S., Additional Mission Director, Madhya Pradesh Rajya Shiksha Kendra, nominee of Mrs. Snehlata Shrivastava, Principal Secretary, School Education, Government of Madhya Pradesh and Chairman of the Regional Advisory Committee. **Ms. H.K. Sanhotra, Assistant Commissioner and Member Secretary welcomed all the members and gave a brief on the mission and vision of KVS and the aims and objectives of Regional Advisory Committee. There after discussion on various agenda items were held as under:**

- 1. Mr. P. Madan, Education Officer, KVS, Bhopal Region presented a brief report on the activities and explained various strategies and steps being taken for the improvement of academic activities of the Region. He also read out the minutes of the last meeting which was confirmed by the members of the committee. It was informed to the committee that as decided in the last meeting teachers of KV No.1 Bhopal and KV Bairagarh adopted weak students on experimental basis to analyze his or her strength and weakness. All the Principals of KVs this Region were also advised to follow similar method and encourage teachers to adopt weak students.**
- 2. Mr. Sunil Shrivastava, Principal, Kendriya Vidyalaya No.1, Bhopal then presented a power point presentation highlighting various activities and achievements in the field of academics and co-curricular activities. He also presented details of thinkquest, CMP, New Library Policy, Life Skills, ICT Infrastructure, NAEP, Integrity club etc., The members appreciated the improvement made in Class-X & XII Result. Dr. H.P. Rajguru, hon'ble member, suggested that Scout and Guide Activities may be given due priority.**
- 3. Ms. H.K. Sanhotra, Assistant Commissioner, informed about the proposals received for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas at Burhanpur & Harda. Proposals from Raisen, Tikamgarh, Alirajpur, Lalitpur and Ashok Nagar are awaited. The Committee strongly recommended the opening of Kendriya Vidyalaya at Bangrasia, near Bhopal which was also recommended by the committee in its last meeting. The Asstt. Commissioner also informed the committee about the status position of land transferred by the State Government to KVS in respect of KV Datia and Shajapur. Mr. Vikas**

Mishra, SDM, informed the committee that the State Government has waived the fee of Rs.10 lacs for transfer of land in respect of KV Datia.

4. Mr. Vikas Mishra, SDM, Bhopal suggested that ramps and separate toilets may be provided in all Kendriya Vidyalayas for physically challenged students. Mr. A.P. Singh, Chief Engineer, CPWD, suggested that all new building should have a provision of ramp. It is also suggested that classes in which physically challenged students are studying may be as far as possible be in the ground floor to avoid inconvenience to those students. The Member Secretary informed that KVS had already issued directions to this effect.
5. Mr. Vikas Mishra, SDM., also suggested that the Principal should be given more monitoring power to monitor the construction of the building so that quality of construction can be ensured. He has also suggested that two students may be associated with the monitoring committee. The SDM pointed out that the construction of KV No.2 Bhopal needs monitoring. The Assistant Commissioner informed that there is a monitoring Committee in all the KVs constituted with the purpose of closely monitoring all construction works to ensure quality of the work done as per scope and specifications. The Assistant Commissioner also informed the committee about the construction works going on in the Region. The work of KV Ajni and OF Itarsi is nearing completion and will be taken over shortly by the KVS. In Vidisha building has already been taken over.
6. The Committee felt that old books in the library be condemned and new books may be procured from time to time. Some members also suggested that latest books pertaining to competitive examinations be procured for the benefit of students who wish to appear for PET/PMT etc. Members also felt that Career Guidance and Counseling needs to be strengthened in all KVs. The house was informed about the new library policy of the KVS.
7. The Committee also suggested that more emphasis on spoken English be given in KVs. Dr. Shobhana Vaypayee Maroo, Principal, Govt. Girls PG Colleges expressed that the students coming from Kendriya Vidyalaya even though opt for English medium, lack speaking skills in English. Mr. Chandrahas Dubey, I.A.S., Additional Mission Director, Madhya Pradesh Rajya Shiksha Kendra suggested that E.F.L. Bangalore has developed very good C.Ds. in this area which may be obtained by the Vidyalayas. Mr. Chandrahas Dubey, I.A.S., also suggested that KVs being a big organization may utilize its resources and CDs and other resource materials be produced in this direction.
8. Members also suggested Alumni Association in the KVs be rejuvenated and their support and participation be invited for development of the Vidyalaya as is being done by professional institutes like IITs/IIMs. Members

suggested Great Achievements of students may also be displayed in the school like merit score board.

9. Members also suggested that the VVN fund available with the Vidyalaya must be utilized by the Principals judiciously for the development of physical facilities of the Vidyalaya.
10. Mr. Vikas Mishra, SDM, suggested that Training may be provided to Group D staff of Vidyalayas. It was informed by the Member Secretary that training for Group D staff has already been carried out by the Regional Office and training to Lab Attendant is in progress.
11. Mr. Sunil Shrivastava explained about the life skills being taught in Class 3rd and 4th and also Common Minimum programme and Expected learning out come / minimum level of competency. He also informed the members about Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation. Mr. Chandrahas Dubey, I.A.S., suggested that for Learning Assessment Test (Primary) immediately the web based test is required. Web based monitoring and evaluation may be carried out as is being done by the Rajya Shiksha Kendra to increase transparency. He also invited the members to visit [educationportal.mp.gov.in](http://educationportal.mp.gov.in). He also offered the facility of video conferencing available with the Rajya Shiksha Kendra.
12. Members suggested that the Second shift running in KV No.3 Bhopal may be shifted to KV No.1 Bhopal or KV No.2 Bhopal by increasing one section in these schools as KV No.3 Bhopal is in the outskirts of the city and parents are always asking for local transfer from KV No.3 Bhopal to KV No.1/No.2 Bhopal. Chairman Advisory Committee suggested that the Principal KV No.3 Bhopal may send such proposal through PTA/VMC.
13. The Chairman of the Meeting also suggested that the Regional Advisory Committee meeting be held in regular intervals and at least twice in a year. The members unanimously agreed that the next meeting be held in the month of June 2010.
